Esther Nyantekyiwaah Appiah

Esther is a member of the National Security Council (NSC) of the Republic of Ghana. She was Director of the Women and Juvenile Unit of the Ghana Police Service, and previous to that Head of the Special Investigations Unit, Fraud Unit and Homicide Unit of the Ghana Police Service among several others. She served as United Nations Lead Investigator in Eritrea, Bosnia, East Timor, Sudan and Ethiopia. She is author of the "Healing Balm" (2006).



H.E. Ambassador Dr. William G.M. Brandful

Ambassador Brandful was High Commissioner of Ghana to Zambia. His previous diplomatic assignments were at the Embassy of Ghana in Bamako, Mali as Minister Plenipotentiary and Deputy Ambassador, with oversight responsibility for the Chancery and directly in charge of matters covering Political and Economic relations; Embassy of Ghana in Bonn, Federal Republic of Germany.


